TRUSTEES' REPORT Happy New Year to the UMC family! As I begin my term of office as the chair of the Trustees, I plan on several new initiatives for the Trustees.

First, we're going to take a very expansive view of our role in church governance, sort of a "executive committee" which formulates ideas and proposals and then brings them to the Church Council and the Charge Conference, as applicable, for approval and implementation.

Secondly, we're going to confront head on the primary concern facing UMC, namely increasing the size of the congregation. Doing this will address an equally pressing concern, namely UMC's financial resources for operations. While our recent fund raising activities have been very successful, we risk going to the "well too often" and burning out both contributors and the volunteers who organize these great events. Increasing our congregation's size will largely address this "bottom line" concern and, of course, increase UMC's energy and programs that it will be able to offer to its members.

Third, since I will also be wearing the hat of chair of the Finance Committee, I hope to integrate its planning closely with the Trustees' deliberations, since so much of what UMC can and cannot do will be dictated by its financial situation. In this process, we would like to invite members to attend the Trustees and Finance Committee meetings and bring your ideas and suggestions to our attention.

In 2014, I will attempt to hold monthly meetings of the Trustees on the first Monday of each month. Finance Committee meetings will take place on the third Thursday of each month. In January, the Trustees will meet on Monday, January 13 at 7 PM in the Fellowship Hall or Kitchen, depending on attendance. Likewise, the next meeting of the Finance Committee will be Thursday, January 16 at 4 PM at UMC. We invite all interested UMC members to attend these meetings and bring us your suggestions for action.

Working together, we can build a stronger, livelier UMC now and in the future. Please join with the Trustees in that exciting and important endeavor!
